ALTERNATIVE WORLDS NEED ALTERNATIVE MEDIA

There can be no free thought without a free press. As the mainstream media becomes monopolised by corporate and state interests, it has become increasingly urgent for alternative communities to publish alternative media of their own. When the power to inform, communicate, and share a vision of the world becomes centralised in the hands of a small number of people, alternative worldviews become silenced. Yet as the dominant global outlook takes us hurtling towards a planetary dead end, other visions of the world have become increasingly important. As the Zapatistas tell us: "The world we want is one where many worlds fit" freedom of speech and diversity of thought are the only way towards the realisation of a world in which other worlds are possible.

In 2012, Ozorian Prophet founder and visionary Gerely Borbely published the first edition of the newspaper in your hands today. His vision was radical: to spread the reach of alternative ideas, values, and culture - and make room for the alternative worlds that our community envisions. In his commitment to freedom of speech and thought, Gerely continues a legacy of underground press that goes back over a hundred years.


Those in power have always had an interest in controlling the circulation of information, restricting the while dissenting voices

have always found ways to resist. and photocopied - helped in the Early radical thinkers like Marx or Proudhon printed critical pamphlets and manifestos of their own, whose influence have shaped modern Euro-American history. As printing methods became cheaper and more accessible, alternative voices began to emerge, increasingly numerous and diverse.

In the late 1960s, British anarchist, photographer, and psychedelic icon Hoppy Hopkins started the International Times, an underground publication which provided space for ideas that were not accepted elsewhere, challenging the status quo and proudly promoting counterculture values. The IT was one of hundreds of alternative newspapers which came to be known as the Underground Press in the sixties and seventies. In the wake of a rising youth movement who did not feel their perspectives were represented by society at large, these publications not only offered alternative worldviews, but a vision of a world in which multiple and contradictory worlds could co-exist.

These publications fostered a sense of community, a common ethos within the counterculture movement, and the knowledge that similar things were happening elsewhere, contributed towards the growth and reach of the sixties youth movement. In the eighties, Zines - small booklets, sometimes hand-written

creation of punk subcultures. With the development of radio, new platforms for grass-roots transmissions emerged, and the proliferation of pirate radio stations opened space for new listening communities - from Reggae and Ska fans in London, to the underground Techno scene in Rome - and encouraged novel forms of expression.

New technologies change the media landscape, and open new possibilities for communication. As soon as the internet emerged, alternative groups saw its potential for the distribution of information and dissemination of ideas. In a 1997 meeting on 'Freeing the Media', the Zapatista movement's Subcomandante Marcos delivered the following message:

"We have a choice: we can have

a cynical attitude in the face of the media, to say that nothing can be done about the dollar power that invades not just with an invasion of power, but with a way of seeing that world, of how they think the world should look. We could say, well, "That's the way it is" and do nothing. Or we can simply assume incredulity: we can say that any communication by the media monopolies is a total lie ... But there is a third option that is neither conformity, nor skepticism, nor distrust: that is to construct a different way—to show the world what is really happening—to have a critical world view and to become interested in the truth of what happens to the people who inhabit every corner of this world."

When Gerely founded the Ozorian Prophet, he joined these pioneers and became part of the history of the alternative press. This colourful publication, and the free-flow of crazy ideas it contains, has nourished the Ozorian community for over six years, helping us feel united as a community, that shares the creative impulse to envision alternative worlds. Our physical newspaper is printed and distributed every day of the festival, and online versions can be found all year round. RadioOzora plays its part too - by sharing recorded performances and podcasts from Ozorian artists, the sonic experience of the festival is brought to people's homes.

All these media help create an Ozorian community that lives on after the festival has ended, opening space for our music, arts, and ideas - and for our alternative vision of the world we live in.

With great sorrow we must share some sad news: at the end of last year, Gerely Borbely made his transition from this world, leaving us with heavy hearts. But he also left us with a mission to fulfil - to encourage the proliferation of radical ideas by growing our alternative media platforms, opening space for the radical visions of the world that they make possible. On the first day of Ozora 2018, Gerely's ashes were scattered around our special festival site - here his brilliant mind and caring heart will permeate our magic space, and inspire inquisitive ideas in the minds of Ozorians for years to come. We at the Ozorian Prophet plan to realise Gerely's dream, extending our media networks to the global freak community. But this mission we cannot complete alone - if you would like to be part of the alternative media team, we would love to hear your ideas. Alternative cultures need alternative networks of information. If we are to foster the freak community's creative ideas on how to build an alternative world, we need to reclaim the platforms for discussion and debate, encouraging the diversity that we need if we are to envision a world with an alternative future.

We talked to Gregor Réti, lecturer on 'Sex and the Death of Ego' at Chambok on Sunday at 10 am. As co-curator and all-round head of Chambok, Giorgia Gaia said: "On the last day we wish to open up the heart chakra once again, so we're dealing with the feminine energies, and sexuality.

T.O.P. – Why is it important that we die? Let the ego go? G.R.: -I went through an experience in my life due to which I totally lost my fear of death. So I started to analyse fear. What is fear? G. R. - We have the two polarisations, or duality. The negative pole is spinning back and forth, and it always wants to intimidate you. Don't trust others, don't go into relationships. Ego always strives for isolation. The strongest force that can develop and fight the fear is courage. That's where courage comes in.

T.O.P. - Yesterday Tim Freke told us in our live interview at Ozoroa that it is through the ego that we can reach transformation. Through our unique patterns. G. R. – Buddha said it 2700 years ago. Whatever you do, you cannot fight the ego. The point is: you don't need to fight. You have the thought between good and bad, step back, and just watch that. And that will bring a transformation, a transparence, these thoughts shrink away.
