

SACRED MOMENTS

CEREMONY HELPS US TO ADOPT A TRANSITION, A NEW BEGINNING OR SOMETIMES A CONCLUSION TO AN EVENT IN OUR LIVES. THE OPENING CEREMONY IS ALWAYS A POWERFUL ACT FOR US AND THE ENTIRE OZORIAN COMMUNITY, WHICH MARKS THE BEGINNING OF OUR ANNUAL CELEBRATION OF DANCE, TRANCE AND UNITY.

The final choreography mostly remains the same - following an afternoon of playing, laughing, gathering and performing, the "march" arrives at the main dancefloor, where the surrounding hills are already filled with excited children of all ages. While the Sun slowly descends to the horizon, the thrill grows, and the crowd inevitably rumbles and echoes the sounds of eagerness to finally touch the ground of the sacred valley where magic happens.

As the daylight melts into the sky, the horse riders appear on the hilltop and light their torches. While the rhythmic beats of the drums fill up the space. one rider blows the horn, and the hoofs of the horses pound on the ground as they ride around the scene of our forthcoming transformation. The ritual ends with the lighting of the bonfire, which marks the opening of the stage and the first dance following the run onto the dancefloor.

While the ceremony is quite lucid to all, the symbolism behind it might not be. Its elements are deeply rooted in our culture and the characteristics of human nature. You see, the riders are very authentic and traditional people, some of the few who still believe in a close-to-nature, simple lifestyle that our ancestors lived for a long time before technology and urbanisation changed our behaviour.

Their group, their family travels the country on horseback, living and breathing together with their animals. Talking to them takes me back in time, and teaches me about their ways with every quiet word, every humble gesture. I got quite fond of one of them, Péter, who is a bit more talkative than the rest of the team. I really enjoyed that after a traditional "bogrács lecsó" dinner he stated that his plate wasn't actually dirty, it had only touched food, so he rinsed it lightly with water and cleaned it with a mint leaf he had just picked in the garden.

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This group of Hungarians originate from the Jász ethnic group, a nomadic tribe that settled in the medieval Kingdom of Hungary during the 13th century. The symbol of the Jász, the symbol of their belonging, the most feared relic of the Jászság is the Jász horn. It is also an inalienable part of the history of our nation, as it has been linked to one of our most beautiful ancient legends and the figure of chieftain Lehel.

Horses and riding have played a key role in our history since ancient times. Our ancestors began domesticating horses cca. 6000 years ago, so their presence has been part of our development. Riding and mounted archery traditions are still much cherished in Hungary:

"I couldn't live without horses, I couldn't imagine my life. For me, paradise on earth is among the horses." – Gyula Dallos.

The history and original homeland of the Hungarian nomadic tribe is debated to this day but it's most likely that the "Magyars" migrated through the Eurasian steppes as hunter-gatherers before their arrival to Europe. To see a close example of the way our ancestors lived, we can visit the cultures of the still existing Sámi people, an indigenous Finno-Ugric people inhabiting Sápmi (northern parts of Scandinavia and Russia). Today, with the blooming of modern nomad lifestyles (digital nomads, global nomads, snowbirds and the RV lifestyle), we can recognize how deeply it is planted in our nature, how much it is part of our evolution and our being to be out in the wild, relying on nature to survive and building symbiotic relationships with the animals we domesticate.

Both Christian and Muslim sources say the Magyars worshipped forces of nature. They gave offerings to trees, fountains, and stones, and made sacrifices at wells. Artifacts portraying some bird of prey or a tree of life imply both symbols were important elements of the old Magyar religion.

Shamanism is also part of our heritage with the "táltos" as the practitioner, who is believed to interact with the spirit world through altered states of consciousness, such as trance through the use of entheogens or ritual performances. Entheogens have been used in a ritualized context for thousands of years; their religious significance is well established in anthropological and modern evidence.

According to shamanism, everything in existence forms one unit, this is the Divine principle; I am one with heaven and earth in it and on it with everything that exists. The central element of shamanism is the "inner spiritual journey" driven by the sound of rhythmic drums.

The drum is also often referred to as the shaman's horse.

Historically, it is often associated with indigenous and tribal societies, and involves the belief that shamans, with a connection to the otherworld, have the power to heal the sick, communicate with spirits, and escort the souls of the dead to the afterlife. In most ancient cultures, there is a shamanic tradition that dates back to a time when people felt closer to the spiritual world and its inhabitants.

The beliefs of the Hungarian people were once of a similar nature. This is also preserved by the special features of certain folk customs, tales, rhymes, and the belief system organized around the figure of the "táltos". The shape of the shaman's magic drum has also been preserved.

Finally, fire has a major role in our ceremony. Fire is creation, fire is destruction, fire is transformation.

"Fire represents many things to many people and cultures. It is recognized as a purifier, a destroyer and as the generative power of life, energy and change. It represents illumination and enlightenment, destruction and renewal, spirituality and damnation." – G. Varner.

Fire has been controlled and used by the ancestors of modern man for at least one million years. It is a very significant element in the principle of human development.

All of these symbols help to transmit some of our values and heritage. As David Oldfield put it so touchingly:

"Rituals and ceremonies are an essential and basic means for human beings to give themselves and others the necessary messages which enable the individual to stay human. They communicate acceptance, love, a sense of identity, esteem, shared values and beliefs and shared memorable events. Every ritual contains tender and sacred moments. And in those moments of sensitivity, we are taken out of the normal flow of life, and out of our routines. We are then in an event that is irreplaceable and sacred. In ritual we participate in something deep and significant. They are moments which move our heart and touch our spirit."

Just like the tribe has been missing its Ozorian home, the Ozorian land's Zimanyi family has also been missing the tribe. When someone remarked to them that at least there was peace and quiet instead of the festival madness, Arpad Zimanyi–who inherited 'caring for Paradise' from his O.Z.O.R.A.-founding father, our now star-shepherding Dani Bácsi–exclaimed: "But there's peace and quiet here all the time!"

Meanwhile, despite the silent, eventless summer in the Valley, the family and crew are not losing time. They're using it to get on with some of the plans that get sidelined by the priorities and unexpected challenges of each season.

The photo captioned "This is going to be very special" has already sparked our imagination. The Prophet contacted the sources and begged for just a few more crumbs of information...




Spoilers ahead.

This used to be a storehouse for crops, a granary, to be more exact. There's even an old grain scale in it. Everything except the walls is in really bad shape, almost fit for demolition. Local teams have started renovations, using local materials, like our very own reed for the roof. In the meantime, we managed to make an inventory of all the artwork, which has grown into a pretty large private collection (577 pieces) throughout the many-many years, and we had been dreaming of a place on the farm that could serve as their permanent exhibition space.

THE DARTH FROG COLLECTIVE'S

FIRST OPENAIR PARTY COULD NOT HAVE COME AT A BETTER TIME. FOR MANY OF US TRANCE SEEKERS, WHO WERE FORTUNATE ENOUGH TO BE THERE, THE EVENT WENT DOWN IN PSY-STORY AS A MUCH-MUCH NEEDED LOCKDOWN REALITY-SHAKER, SPIRIT MEDICINE... THERE WAS STEAM TO BLOW OFF, AND YOU MADE US REALIZE YET AGAIN HOW AMAZING IT CAN BE, TO JOIN THE CIRCLE.

So, who are the masterminds behind this in so many ways perfect mini gathering. Who is the Darth Frog Collective? How did it all begin? You licked a frog and it spoke, "Luke, I am your father"...?

Mudassasi: The Darth Frog Collective is a group of djs, organisers, visual and performance artists. It all started with a previous team most of us worked in but it couldn't satisfy our needs for the quirky, filthy tunes of the swamp. So we started our own, building from previous experiences we had in the scene and also from the works we have in our everyday life as well. We wanted to create something that could satisfy the lovers of progressive and slower tunes and at the same time be twisted enough for the dark community as well.

AlphaKey: The founders of the team are Lucas (Nekros), Bence (Mudassasi) and myself, Marci. We wanted to make something that hasn't been done for a long time: showing something completely new to the trancers while maintaining good quality and passionate organising, and also giving attention to the smallest details as well. Because they count more than one would think.

The team has expanded a bit since. We have more people helping us in the background, without their help, we couldn't have made it so far. There's Emőke, our main administrative work fella, Gergő (Megaloman), who helps us with legal things. After our first party in January, Szabi (Zegotha) also joined our forces to spread the medicine of the toad.

WHAT'S THE MAIN MISSION AND INSPIRATION? YOU SAY YOUR "GOAL IS TO POPULARISE THE NEGLECTED DARK PROGRESSIVE PSYTRANCE, ZENONESQUE, MINIMAL-PSY, PSY-BASS, GLITCH AND PSYDUB STYLES IN HUNGARY." WHAT EXPERIENCES DID YOU HAVE TO COME TO THIS CONCLUSION AND REALIZE THIS NICHE IS NEGLECTED? WHAT WAS THE PSY THAT GOT YOU HOOKED IN THE FIRST PLACE?

AlphaKey: The very first zenonesque/darkprog that hooked me first was Pspiralife's "Have you not heard?" track. That made me realize that this style is full of goodness everyone needs to hear. Since the style has been untouched for years in Hungary we saw great potential in this, because everyone likes zenon progressive but there are many-many people who just

don't know it yet.

Mudassasi: When I lived in the UK all the chill stages were full of wobbly basslines and quirky tunes, but when I came home, I realized no one had ever heard of the styles I'm all into. The first ever psy that really got me was Kalya Scintilla's Feeling Good, from that point I was looking for more of the organic soundscapes and eventually ended up listening and playing the twisted tunes of psybass and zenonesque.

Swamp Seance had a main and alternative floor. What did you have in mind when choosing the artists for the lineup? In what way do Darth Frog's ideas on the alternative and main stage programs complement each other musically?

AlphaKey: Being given the extraordinary times we are living in now, Swamp Seance was also an extraordinary event with the main stage starting with dark progressive and peaking up to nighttime psytrance in the middle of the night, we wanted to make sure that everyone finds the suitable BPM range for themselves. That's why we decided to book dj's playing suitable, fat-basslined progressive-ish techno for the alternative stage. So, for example, if you found the peak hours too harsh, you could go see the alternative stage and what technodelia it could offer you.

Mudassasi: We wanted something that can counterbalance the overflowing psychedelia of the mainstage. When the main was the fastest and twisted our heads around, the alternative floor's techno was more bound to the ground and could help to bring you back for a while.

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FOR US WHO STARTED GOA-FREAKING BACK IN THE 90'S AT ILLEGAL AND STILL TOTALLY UNDERGROUND SMALL GATHERINGS OUT IN THE BACKS OF NATURE WITH ONLY A COUPLE HUNDRED PEOPLE AT MOST, SWAMP SEANCE REMINDED US OF THE UNPARALLELED FORCE OF THESE KINDS OF PARTIES. IT SEEMS TO BE THEWAY WE CAN SURVIVE IN THIS SUMMER'S FEST-LESSNESS AS WELL, TO SAY THE LEAST... IS THERE A GOAL TO MAKE LARGER EVENTS TOO, OR WOULD YOU PREFER TO KEEP IT AS "INTIMATE" AS THIS WAS?

Mudassasi:For now we're only planning for small but top quality events every half a year. This way we have the time to prepare and figure out new inventions for our parties and also keep our events' ceremonial vibe by not doing it every month.

AlphaKey: Well, we don't close our minds before thoughts of greater events like a thousand-ish people at a summer open air party someday. But first we have to make sure that what we do does attract people. The amount of people that were present at Swamp Seance was more than a very good feedback for us. I strongly believe that if you put a lot of love and a lot of energy into something, it will be fruitful in the end no matter how many hard times you had during the procedure. We will keep to small gatherings for a long time because we want to build up a fanbase for what we do carefully, step by step.

THE LOCATION IS ALWAYS A TOP PRIORITY WITH THE PSY SCENE'S OPEN-AIR EVENTS. HOW DID YOU FIND KOKA, WHAT MADE YOU CHOOSE THIS UNTOUCHED PIECE OF NATURAL BLISS?

AlphaKey: Well, the answer to that is very easy. We had a little party over there before with our friends, playing for each other. Of course we quickly fell in love with the venue. Then we got to know the owner of the land, who is a great person with a progressive attitude so a friendship was made right there.

I LOVED YOUR PLANTABLE WRISTBANDS: TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOUR GREEN-THUMBED ATTITUDE, AND WHAT ASPECTS, IDEOLOGIES, PROGRAMS YOU'D LIKE TO EMBRACE WITH YOUR EVENTS BESIDES TOP-NOTCH MUSIC?

Mudassasi: It's pretty hard to maintain a party in the way we want to but small steps eventually lead to the point where we can do it with less waste and more in harmony with nature. The wristband was an idea like this. We've seen what happens to the wristbands after a party, even the fabric ones will eventually end in landfills. Ours can be grown into wildflowers for bees or salads for the participants. As you grow it, you will grow with it as well.

We are planning on doing a workshop and lecture event series focusing mainly on permaculture and gardening, natural building methods and creative, green problem solving. As we see it, the future is in the hands of people whose new ideas are getting us closer to nature and not further from it.

What were the challenges, and rewards of organizing the event, what would you do exactly the same or differently for the next one? Do you have a next one in mind - spoilers:)?

AlphaKey: There were a lot of challenges we had to beat. Firstly, due to the pouring rains on that week we had to organize the land into good condition again: pounding the ground with heavy machinery on both the dancefloor and in the parking spaces. We also had to make the alternative stage out

of nothing. After this all the legal stuff was a walk in the park really.

The goal of this event was to show the Hungarian scene that you can still make an event out of mere passion and love no matter the work you have to put in. I hope everyone took notice of this, which would be our reward.

Mudassasi: As we see the psytrance scene was always about innovation, and you can clearly see that at big festivals, but the smaller party segment seemed a bit stuck, so we decided to try new ways, new ideas. Trials and errors. Coming up with new ideas and methods can be pretty risky but in the end, when you see people smiling and enjoying themselves, you forget every other thing and it glues a smile on your face too.

What are you otherwise doing when you're not Drath Frog-ing, what are you working on, any side projects, anything cooking in your individual LABORATORIES?

Mudassasi: I have a decoration team for parties under the name Dharmatronic, so I mainly do that. We are doing it with my old time friends, Fedor & Gergő. With the wristbands we are planning to grow in the future as well, hoping that people will like it and it will inspire organisers to replace the plastics with something sustainable. Besides these, there are many-many other projects under construction.

AlphaKey: If I'm not doing Darth Frog stuff, I usually play nightpsy in other parties. I'm also on the road to learning to produce my own music to release one day...

Mini SUN Festival

The secret gathering 2020

-through the eyes of an organizer and DJ during the pandemic-

THIS YEAR STARTED UNUSUALLY AND WITH DIFFICULTY FOR EVERYONE, INCLUDING MYSELF. AT THE BEGINNING OF THE QUARANTINE, I LOST MY SOURCES OF INCOME, AS THEY WERE ALL CONNECTED TO MUSIC EVENTS. BOOKINGS AND GIGS WERE CANCELLED, WE HAD NO IDEA WHAT WE WERE GOING TO DO AND WHAT WAS COMING...

Luckily, I made good use of the lockdown, rested, recharged, studied and got a lot of help in the hard times.

Unfortunately, the SUN festival (Deep-Smile Foundation) also lost revenues, and we found ourselves behind the eight ball. Then at the beginning of the summer our government made some concessions, and when we heard we could hold parties of up to 500 visitors, in addition to seeing football games held with several thousand spectators and people going to beaches in crowds, we felt that we would have enough space to be together while also keeping up social distancing on a 100-hectare territory. So, we decided to have a smaller, family gathering, because everyone was in need of a little recharge in nature, meeting friends and good music, which is not restricted by four walls. But we had to think and act quickly.


We knew that we couldn't take any risks, we had to follow all the rules and instructions. This is why we basically invited only artists who are part of or stand close to SUN. The whole event was private, those invited had already bought their presale tickets for the big event planned for this year, and we sent a newsletter to our members. It felt like some commando action, but everyone invited managed to keep the secret pretty well. This was the only way we could do it, because if word had got out about the event, several thousand people might have appeared, and we wouldn't have been able neither to handle it or take responsibility for them, and we were in no way prepared for such a big crowd infrastructurally. With 500 people, however, we couldn't




afford to have more stages, so all the artists had to fit on one. It was an exciting challenge to put together the timetable—making sure that the artist is there at the exact time, that it has an arch, and that every guest has something to enjoy music-wise... What's more, we couldn't have a 4-day-stomp either, we had to put in slower-paced performers every day too, so that people's minds, bodies, spirits could quiet down so they could have fun longer.

Originally, we planned for a 4-day-long festival, which we prolonged a bit, but it was mainly for the team by then, and I have to say, as an organizer, this was much more enjoyable and comfortable than the 8-day-long big festival last year, when we have to be on standby almost non-stop, and there's loads of work to do all day, all night, and in addition, there were fewer team members this time as well, mostly coming to relax, but it was fine like this.

This year's festival was totally different, yet it still reflected SUN vibes. Csobankapuszta is always a magical location, and the workers and guests make it even more special. It's like being in a wonderland bubble there. Somehow, the energies are all harmonized, elevating our feeling of existence. Perhaps we could experience this even more so this year because the whole event was more concentrated. I had many amazing moments myself. So many smiles, thanks and hugs from people, many beautiful meetings.





We did miss the main stage, the gem of the festival, but at least its opening next year will be an even bigger blast. It did make things easier, though, because we didn't have to walk miles, as everything was in one place. However, every artist was well prepared and we could hear truly amazing sets. We were lucky because we could invite two foreign artist friends too, (Boom Shankar, Goa Bernie), who elevated to the festival atmosphere with their presence. We also love asking DJs to play first-time b2b sets, which always turn out great and very exciting, like this year: Oleg and Ikoza, me and Eltwave, and in the end, Boom Shankar & Kory & Goa Bernie with a "threesome", all fantastic acts. The whole team was very happy, you couldn't wipe the grin off our faces, and of course, as always, we got really exhausted by then end, but it was worth it. Many feel this was the best SUN fest in years, probably because of the cozy family vibes. I'm really grateful.

And of course, there's no stopping. As soon as summer kicked off, I was lucky to get a lot of gig invites, as a DJ, I've been traveling almost every week, so I am very happy that I have opportunities like this in these times. We don't know how long this will last, and of course, we take care of each other, of ourselves, as the danger is real, but life cannot stop, it's just transforming. We hope this goes smoothly, and I trust that we will be able to hold the reborn SUN festival next year.

"after 4 months in lockdown, let me share some memories with you..."

was born in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia, in **1** 1940... and all my teen years were in that city. "THE FIFTIES"... talk about pubs and Curfew... The Pubs closed at 6pm, so everyone rushed to the bar and ordered as many pints as they could, and as far as Curfew... nobody went out after 7 or 8pm in Melbourne in the fifties, nowhere to go, maybe a drive-in movie, but things were tough and boring then... the bad old days... James Dean, and pimples, all one wanted was a drink and to go out and have fun. And where are we NOW??? Have been at home for 4 months, and now like a pregnant hyena at a watering hole, howl for better times...

The biggest problem, about Melbourne, was Leaving it. Planes were too expensive in the Fifties to fly to Europe, so my dad had a mate who ran a small cargo ship sailing for India, and the fare was just 10 dollars.
